

REFLECTION: It is very strange for us to reach the climax of our Lenten journey when we should be celebrating together the central mysteries of our Christian Faith. The Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord brings us back to the birth of our Christian Faith and Church. The meeting between God and Abram introduced us to the Covenant God made with him. He would be the Father of a great nation, his descendants as many as the grains of sand on the seashore, they would live in the land He would give them. The Covenant would be a perpetual one. Abram was old, but had no family. Yet he believed in God, his name was changed to Abraham, whom we refer to in our Liturgy as our Father in the Faith. The Old Testament is a history of the children of Abraham till God fulfilled His promises through His Son Jesus who took his humanity from the people of Israel, the son of Abraham. Jesus would be for the rest of time the promise of the New and Eternal Covenant God makes with His people in Body and Blood of His Son, the new and eternal sacrifice. In these times we will celebrate these mysteries, the celebration of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Passion and Death of Jesus on Good Friday and the joy and glory of the Resurrection on Easter Day. But our Churches will be empty. On the other hand our homes will be full. Our Bishops and Priests will celebrate the Liturgy alone but the empty Church and the full home can surely be united in the Faith we share from our Baptism, in our Love for God which allows us to share from a distance the prayer of our priests and so be at one as we thank Our Lord for this unbreakable Covenant He allows us to share. In the strangeness of these times let us celebrate the Words with which Jesus began His ministry "I come that you might have Life and have it more abundantly".

PARISH NEWS



Our Bishops have made the decision to suspend all Public Masses till further notice. Our Churches are now closed and Baptisms and Marriages are all postponed. The Sacrament of Penance is by appointment with me or any priest you choose. Funerals will only involve the Burial at Cemetery or Committal at Crematorium with only priest and immediate family and close friends present. A private Mass will be offered on the day of burial with a Memorial Mass to be arranged after normal times return. During Holy Week you can follow Mass through the Internet or on Social Media. Many Parishes in the Diocese and Country will be offering us this opportunity and I also recommend Mass being relayed live from Knock Shrine at 12noon and 7pm each day on the web-site of the Shrine.

This Holy Week Dioceses and Parishes are being encouraged to join with Pope Francis as he celebrates the Sacred Triduum from Rome that in this worldwide time of trial, the whole Church can be at one in our Praise of God but also in supplication that this danger can speedily be removed from our midst.

Time-Table for Pope Francis through internet and Facebook on Vatican Web-site:

Palm Sunday April 5th 10am. Holy Thursday April 9th Mass of Lord's Supper 5pm. Good Friday April 10th. Liturgy of the Passion 5pm Way of the Cross 8pm. Easter Vigil Mass April 11th 8pm Easter Morning Mass April 12th 10am followed by Pope's Blessing "Urbi et Orbi". These times are our local times.

I continue to offer Mass privately daily at 6pm for this intention and for those who find these days and restrictions difficult. During Holy Week I will livestream the main celebrations of the Sacred Triduum to fit in with the broadcasts from Rome.

Time-table for St Brigid's available through our Parish Facebook Page:

Holy Thursday: Mass of the Last Supper; 7pm. Good Friday; Meditation on Way of the Cross 12noon. Easter Sunday 12noon.

This is a time too to return to the importance of family and personal prayer. The Rosary and Stations of the Cross are powerful ways to pray at home, pleading with the Lord to quickly take the weight of this present cross from our shoulders.
