The hallmark of Christian behaviour must be compassion and forgiveness.

**Sat. 12th. The Most Holy Name of Mary:** Her name commemorates the inexpressible love of the Mother of god for her Holy Child. Our eyes are directed to the figure of the Mother of the Redeemer for us to invoke with devotion.
