REFLECTION: In the story of the rich man and Lazarus it is interesting to see that even after their roles are reversed, the rich man still sees Lazarus as his slave who will do his bidding and run his errands. He even tries to bargain with Abraham who points out to him that those who pay no attention to Moses and the prophets will pay no attention even to someone who rises from the dead. This story has an important bite at a lot of what happens today!

OUR DAILY MASSES ARE TAKEN FROM THE TWENTY-SEVENTH WEEK OF THE YEAR except Mon. 7th. Our Lady of the Rosary: Today's celebration urges us all to meditate the Mysteries of Christ following Our Lady's example and reflecting how her life was so closely joined to the Incarnation, Passion and Resurrection of the Lord.

Fri. 11th. St John XXIII (1881-1963) Born in Bergamo in Northern Italy he studied for the Priesthood and was ordained to serve in his own Diocese. Later he was called to serve the Church as an apostolic visitor, delegate and nuncio serving Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece, concerning himself with the problems of the Church in Eastern Europe, and in Paris where assisted the Church in the years following Second World War. Within months of his election to the Papacy he convened the Second Vatican Council which still provides the basis for our Church in the present times.

Sat 12th. St Kenneth (c520- 599): He was born and died in Ireland, but spent time in Wales with St Cadoc and on Iona with St Columba. During his time in Scotland he made many converts and built several Churches. He founded a monastery in St Andrew's and the ruined Abbey of Cambuskenneth still bears his name. His feast is kept in Argyll & the Isles.
