REFLECTION: Peter once heard Jesus say to him "Get behind me, Satan" when he challenged what Jesus wanted to do. Today we find him again getting on the wrong side of the Lord when he shouts out "Lord, if it is you, tell me to come to you". He puts the lord to the test, just as satan tried to do in the desert after the Baptism of jesus by john the Baptist. Jesus challenges Peter's lack of Faith but He is still there for him. How often in our weakness do we mistrust the Lord, yet He never rejects us, He is always there for us.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Nineteenth Week of the Year except.:

Mon. 10th: St Lawrence: Deacon, he served the Church in the 3rd century and was martyred under the persecution of Valerian in 258 four days after the martyrdom of Pope Sixtus II and his fellow Deacons. Devotion to St Lawrence has remained constant since.

Tues. 11th. St Clare (1193 - 1253): Born in Assisi, she was a young friend and companion of St francis and followed him in his life of poverty and faith. She was the founder and leader of the Poor Clares. She lived an austere life of great piety and charity.

Fri. 14th. St Maximilian Kolbe (1894 – 1941). A Polish Franciscan Priest who worked in the Apostolate of the press in Poland and Japan. He died in Auschwitz after volunteering to take the place of a man condemned to death who was the father of a young family.
