REFLECTION: In St Matthew's Gospel he gives us five sermons of the Lord. Jesus speaks to us in parable, seven in total and in Biblical terms seven denotes completion. In these parables of the kingdom we have a complete teaching from jesus about the Kingdom of Heaven. Today we have the first of these parables about the sower. Here Jesus asks us to reflect on why some people hear the Word of God and some do not.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Fifteenth Week of the Year except.:

Wed. 15th: St Bonaventure (1221- 1274): Born in Tuscany he was an early member of the Franciscans and became Minister general of the Order. He was called to be Archbishop of Albano and was also appointed a Cardinal. He was a theologian at the Council of Lyons and an author of many Biblical commentaries and mystical and spiritual works. Many of his prayers are still included in the prayer books of today.

Thurs. 16th. Our Lady of Mount Carmel: This devotion to Our Lady links her with Mount Carmel in Israel, the site of the Prophet Elijah's altar to the one true God and of the 12th century hermit forerunners of the Carmelite Order. Today's feast celebrates Mary as a model of reflection, solitude and prayer.





St Brigid's Church will be open this Sunday for private visits and prayer from 12noon until 2pm with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the opportunity for Confession. Monday and Tuesday the Church will be open from 11am until 1pm and from Wed – Sat the opening time will be 9.30am – 11.30am. This new time will incorporate Morning Mass at 10am which from Wednesday we can celebrate with a restricted number of people present. The Church will also be open Monday to Friday evenings from 6pm till 7pm for private prayer. I am very grateful to those who have volunteered their time to provide the necessary stewards we must have to allow the Church to be open.

Enter the Church by main door and exit is by side door on left near the Sacristy. Our volunteer Stewards will be on hand to guide and direct.

Baptisms and Marriages can now be celebrated with a maximum of twenty people.

The Sacrament of Penance in Sacristy at times shown in Bulletin and by appointment with me (just phone) or any priest you choose.

Funerals can now be celebrated in Church but again with only twenty mourners to be chosen by the family of deceased present in Church.

I continue to offer Mass privately daily at 10am for your intentions.

The date for restricted opening of the Church came a week earlier than expected. We can celebrate Mass with a maximum of fifty people but with two metre social distance respected. Our Church can accommodate about twenty six individual places but families do not need this distance and also families who can create "a bubble" with another family. This leaves us scope to reach closer to the fifty allowed.

Morning Mass from Wednesday will be open on a first come basis. The only Masses to be booked are Saturday vigil at 5.30pm and Sunday morning at 11am. These can be booked on Web page "Eventbrite" Log on to Eventbrite.com.uk. search for which mass you wish to attend, click purchase ticket (no fee), complete the form. You will be asked to fill in your details and those others in your group as well. 45 spaces are available on Eventbrite for each Mass and they will be available again on first come, first served. Print your ticket or copy to your phone. The site will be available from each Wednesday. You have to book each week. Mass will continue to be streamed.

Face covering is essential apart from those exempt because of age or a health problem. Enter church by front door where you will find a box to place your envelope or Offertory contribution. Sanitise your hands and steward will show you to your seat. Communion is in the hand only and at very end of Mass. Step two paces away fro priest or Minister and swallow the Sacred Host then directly leave church by side door. You can spend a moment of contemplation at the Calvary Shrine.
