**REFLECTION:** Today's Feast honours the blessedness that was the destiny of Our Lady,the glorification of the soul and body that completely conformed her to the risen Christ. It is a celebration that offers the Church and all humanity an exemplar and consoling message, teaching us the fulfilment of our highest hopes. Our Lady's place in heaven is the gift and promise of Our Lord to all of us whom He made His brothers and sisters when He took on our humanity, our flesh and blood.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Twentieth Week of the Year except.:

Thurs. 20th: St Bernard (1090-1153): He became a Cistercian monk at Citeaux in 1113. In 1115 he became Abbot of Clairvaux, a new foundation. Under his leadership this monastery became an influential place of prayer, study and welcome as well as the formation of many other communities of Cistercian life from Eastern Europe to Ireland in the West. His writings show a solid grasp of biblical studies, spiritual theology and philosophy. The prayer "The Memorare" links us all to his heritage.

**Fri. 21st. St Pius X (1835 - 1914):** Cardinal Patriarch of Venice, he became Pope in 1903. His great interest was the Liturgy and Sacramental life of the Church. He encouraged frequent reception of Holy Communion welcoming young children to receive this sacrament. Much of his work was crowned later in the century by the Second Vatican Council.

**Sat. 22nd. Queenship of Our Lady:** During the Middle Ages Mary was venerated as Queen of the Angels and Saints. Pope Pius XII prescribed this Feast for the Universal Church at the close of the Marian Year in 1955. Mary's queenly dignity in heaven stems from her motherhood of God and her unique role in the history of salvation. It is placed on this date to stress the connection of Mary's Queenship with the Assumption.



## **PARISH NEWS**



The Church will be open from 9.30am - 11.00am Monday till Saturday for private prayer and our Morning Mass at 10.00am. The numbers for Mass are restricted to fifty. On our week-days it is a case of first come, first served and our volunteer stewards will assist you. Monday till Friday Church is also open for private prayer from 6pm - 7pm.

Saturday Evening Church will be open from 5pm for our Vigil Mass at 5.30pm. On Sunday morning Church will open at 10.30am for our Sunday morning Mass at 11am. These masses are also restricted to fifty people attending subject to demands of social distancing. Places for these masses must be booked in advance on the booking web-page Eventbrite.co.uk where you will find St Brigid's Parish, Newmains and the option to book for Saturday Vigil Mass or Sunday morning 11am Mass. This page will be available each week till normality returns. Our masses will continue to be streamed.

Enter the Church by main door and exit is by side door on left near the Sacristy. Our volunteer Stewards will be on hand to guide and direct. Face covering is essential apart from those who are exempt because of age or health reasons.

Baptisms and Marriages can now be organised but with severely restricted numbers. The Sacrament of Penance will be available on Monday and Friday evening from 6pm – 7pm.and by appointment with me (just phone).

Funerals can now be celebrated in Church with Mass but with an attendance of only twenty people to be chosen by family of deceased.

PARISH CENTRE: We have been able to open the Nearly New Shop and Slimming World will soon resume following their own strict guidelines but sadly we are some way off yet in being able to have social events. The restricted number of families (3) and maximum family size (80) make it impossible to open for family celebrations or other social events.

We are making changes to the way our masses and other devotions will be streamed. We will be using Church Resources tv. Find this page using Google or other search service. It will be free from the conversations or remarks associated with Facebook.
