REFLECTION: Philip, one of the first Deacons in the Church preaches the Gospel and works many miracles among the Samaritans and brings them to faith completing his ministry by baptising them. But the Gift of the Holy Spirit comes through the Apostles. The message of today is the Apostolic Foundation of the Church. The Apostles and their successors, our Bishops, are the gift the world cannot give. It is through them the graces won for us by the Lord are channelled and this is the way of the Church to this day.

<u>**This week</u>** the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Sixth Week of Easter except.:</u>

Thurs. 21st. Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord:

Fri. 22nd. St Rita of Cascia (1381-1457): She married an abusive husband but through prayer and perseverance she moderated his behaviour. He was murdered, a victim of feuds between families and her two sons vowed to avenge his death. She pleaded with them not to follow this way of sin but unsuccessfully. She prayed then that God would take them rather than they commit murder. They both died within a year. She then entered the Religious life and was renowned for her counselling skills with those whose lives were troubled. Canonised in 1900 she is Patron saint of hopeless cases and in recent times a Patron too of women who suffer abuse.

Mon. 18th: Today marks the 100th anniversary of the birth of Pope St John Paul II. Today we remember the Faith and witness of this remarkable man chosen to lead the Church through the later part of 20th century into the 21st and third millennium.
