

REFLECTION: The ideal community St Luke describes in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles would have represented in the first century AD just as in our own day the fulfilment of human longing and the desires of all the great thinkers through history. In human terms impossible, only the Gifts of the Spirit can bring it about. Our hearts must be open to the prompting of the Spirit. This is a free choice each of us must make. Jesus did not force the hard hearted to respond to Himself and His teaching. We have eyes to see, ears to hear, hearts to respond.

<u>Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday</u>. As the image portrays the different shades of the Mercy of God which flows to us from the pierced Heart of Jesus. The channels of Grace are the Sacraments He has given as the Ministry of His Church. The buildings may be closed, the reception of these Sacraments difficult at this time but the Church of Jesus lives on and is fully open if we let it live through us. Where two or three are gathered in my name I am in the midst of them!
