**REFLECTION:** Good and Evil. The original challenge that faced Adam and Eve and a challenge that faces each one of us in every time and culture all through history. Why does God allow evil to exist? Our first parable today might suggest that the destruction of evil might also cause destruction of good! What is clear to us is that God alone will make the judgement on who or what is good or evil. Next Jesus uses the example of the mustard seed and yeast as ways of perceiving how the Kingdom of God grows. Yet the mustard plant was a nuisance to farmers and many saw yeast as a corrupting force in breadmaking. Christians today are still perceived by many to be a corrupting influence and a nuisance! Jesus certainly asks us to reflect on what He teaches us.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Sixteenth Week of the Year except.:

**Wed. 22nd: St Mary Magdalene:** The woman who stood by the Cross of Jesus. With two other women she discovered the empty tomb and was granted an appearance of the Risen Lord early the same day. She has been described as "the Apostle to the Apostles". We honour the graces poured out on this woman who discovered the joy of rejecting evil and choosing good.

Thurs. 23rd. St Bridget of Sweden (1303- 1373: Honoured as a Co-Patron of Europe, was of Royal birth. She married Ulf in 1316 and was the mother of eight children. In her widowhood she established the Bridgettine religious community and led an ascetic and deeply spiritual life. In spite of this she was active with European leaders to restore the Papacy to rome from Avignon. She died and was buried in Rome but later her remains were brought back to Sweden where she is honoured as the Patron saint of the country.

**Sat. 25<sup>th</sup>. St James the Greater**. Son of Zebedee and brother of John, he was the First Bishop of Jerusalem. He was martyred by Herod Agrippa about the year 44AD being the first of the Apostles to die for Jesus. Later for safety his remains were brought to Spain where the great Basilica at Santiago de Compostela was erected to house them. It has been one of the greatest places of pilgrimage down through the centuries.
