**REFLECTION:** Who can kill the soul as well as the body? We normally assume this question refers to Satan, but only the creator God could kill the soul as well as the body and Jesus makes it quite clear that this is not God's intention. In fact the opposite. He tells us not to be afraid, God knows every hair on our heads. If not even a sparrow can fall to the ground without God knowing, how much more precious in God's eyes are his children. There is however a message. We know god's love for each one of us, we must not treat that love with contempt or disdain. Jesus asks us for a whole-hearted response from us.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Twelfth Week of the Year except.:

Mon. 22nd. Sts. John Fisher (1469-1535) and Thomas More (1478-1535): John Fisher was born at Beverley in Yorkshire where he received his early education before going to Cambridge where he was ordained priest. Here he held several posts in the University where he became Vice-Chancellor. Helped financially by Lady Margaret Beaufort he was instrumental in building Christ's and St john's Colleges at Cambridge and the institution of the Lady Margaret Professorships of Divinity at Oxford and Cambridge. In 1504 he was appointed Bishop of Rochester, recommended by King Henry VII as a man of God. Thomas more was a native of London and was a student of the Greek language and Law. During this time he reflected on his vocation and in the end chose the path of marriage. At peace with himself and in the love and joy of his family his life flourished and he became Lord Chancellor under King Henry VIII. When Henry VIII lost his faith and his philosophy changed both these men suffered and refused to collaborate with him in his breach with the Church. For this they were martyred, John fisher on 22<sup>nd</sup> june and Thomas more on 9<sup>th</sup> Juli 1n 1535.

**Wed.24th.** The Birth of St John the Baptist: Son of Zachary and Elizabeth, he lived a life of austerity and penance in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Like the new Elijah, humble yet strong, he prepared his people to receive the Lord. Jesus said of him "of all children born to women, there is no one greater than John".

**Thurs. 25<sup>th</sup>. St Luan (Moluag):** He was a monk of Bangor in Ireland and a contemporary of St Columba. He preached the Gospel to the Picts on Lismore in Ross-shire, building many Churches dedicated to Our Lady. St Bernard of Clairvaux attests to him being the founder of over 100 monasteries. He died in 592 and is honoured in Argyll and the Isles where he was once regarded as Patron Saint.







The re-opening of our Churches for private prayer can begin from tomorrow, Monday 22<sup>nd</sup>. June. Taking our advice from Bishop Joseph, we will open next Sunday, 28<sup>th</sup> June from 12noon until 2pm. During that time there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and I will be available in the Church for Confession.

"Social Distancing" will be in place for some time to come. It means most seats in our Church will be sealed off and careful hygiene practices must be adhered to. What I do need is volunteers to act as stewards and all new volunteers will need to adhere to Church's Safeguarding rules. For this reason I am asking you to volunteer now by text or e-mail in order that we can be ready in time and know what we must do. I will be in contact with those who have volunteered this week and we will try to work out what days and what hours we can offer to be open from next Sunday onwards.

A Funeral Mass can now be offered in Church but with a maximum of fifteen mourners present and again subject to Parish Volunteers being available to ensure the necessary hygiene regulations still demanded are in place. A Memorial Mass can be arranged after normal times return.

I continue to offer Mass privately daily at 10am for your intentions.

I have not forgotten our young people due to receive Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation. You will be our priority so keep praying, preparing and shout out to our God to take this Virus away.

I thank all of you who have switched on to the Mass and Devotions we have streamed so far. We will continue to work at it in the hope we can improve it.

This is a time too to return to the importance of family and personal prayer. The Rosary and Stations of the Cross are powerful ways to pray at home, pleading with the Lord to quickly take the weight of this present cross from our shoulders.

The Parish still depends on your generosity during this time for the usual upkeep and expenses of the Parish. Thank you for your great response to this appeal.
