REFLECTION: On this day, traditionally regarded as the foundation day of Rome by Romulus, we celebrate the twin founders of the Church in Rome. St Peter was a fisherman who became the leader of the Apostles and the rock on which the Church is built. He died by crucifixion in Rome around 64AD. St Paul or Saul the Pharisee became the Apostle of the Gentiles. He was martyred by beheading around 67AD. Both proclaimed with their lives that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Thirteenth Week of the Year except.:

Tues.30th: First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church): We honour the large number of the first members of the Christian Church martyred in the reign of the Emperor Nero around AD64.

Fri. 3rd **July. St Thomas, Apostle:** Son He is said to have proclaimed the Gospel in India where he was martyred. The faith that led him to know Christ in his wounds, also sent him to the farthest places to preach the Gospel of the Lord.







Our prayers and hopes for the re-opening of our Church will be realised today when after our Sunday Mass at 11am still celebrated privately we can open the Church for private prayer. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of StS Peter& Paul brought forward a day this year in Scotland but a great Feast to re-open our Church even in a small way. From Monday to Saturday Church opening times will be 11am – 1pm and 6pm – 7pm.

Baptisms and Marriages are still postponed.

The Sacrament of Penance is by appointment with me (just phone) or any priest you choose and at times I indicate in Bulletin..

Funerals will only involve the Burial at Cemetery or Committal at Crematorium with only priest and immediate family and close friends. A private Mass canl be offered on the day of burial with a Memorial Mass to be arranged after normal times return.

I continue to offer Mass privately daily at 10am for your intentions.

It looks as if 23rd July is the date when we can begin celebrating our Liturgy in Church. would love to give you clearer knowledge of when we look to be back to normal but I have no idea when this will be. Our hope is that we will open for private prayer soon then Mass with reduced congregations and finally normality. I have not forgotten our young people due to receive Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation. You will be our priority so keep praying, preparing and shout out to our God to take this Virus away. We hope to celebrate these moments of joy and grace in September.
