REFLECTION: The Liturgy celebrates the Trinity rather than providing a Theology of the Mystery of the Trinity. We celebrate in the presence of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus outlines this for us beautifully in His words to Nicodemus "God sent His Son into the world so that the world might be saved." We begin and end today's and every day's Liturgy in the name of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

<u>This week</u> the Prayers of our Liturgy, Mass and Divine Office are all from the Tenth Week of the Year except.:

Tues. 9th. St. Columba of Iona (c520 - 597): He was born of a noble family at Gartan near Letterkenny in Donegal. He became a monk at Clonard, studied at Glasnevin and from there founded his own monastery at Derry. Other foundations followed, notably at Durrow and then with a group of monks he sailed to Iona in 563 and established a monastery where he would live until his death in 597. Although St Columba never left Iona his monks evangelized most of the Highland areas of Scotland and were influential in the founding of the monasteries of North East England from Lindisfarne.

Thurs. 11th. St Barnabas: Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew, Joseph his original name who became prominent in the early Church in Jerusalem and given the name Barnabas by the Apostles. He became an Apostle by extension, one of the outstanding converts of the diaspora. He introduced the convert Paul into the Church in Jerusalem. Later he went back to Cyprus with Paul preaching the Gospel and it was there he was martyred. In the Acts of the Apostles he is referred to as "a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith".

Sat. 13th . St Anthony of Padua (1195-1231): Born in Lisbon at the age of 15 he joined the Augustinian Order but inspired by the martyrdom of five early Franciscans he had known he joined this new Order of Franciscans in 1221. He preached in Italy and France with amazing effect. He died in Padua in 1231 and his Shrine there attracts many pilgrims to this day.

As a Parish we continue our prayers and hopes for the re-opening of our Church. This weekend the Bishops of Scotland have issued a Pastoral Letter concerning this and this will be available on Parish Facebook Page and also our Parish Web-Page. What is obvious is that "Social Distancing" will be in place for some time to come. It means most seats in our Church will be sealed off and careful hygiene practices must be adhered to. Our hope is that we will open for private prayer soon then Mass with reduced congregations and finally normality. I have not forgotten our young people due to receive Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation. You will be our priority so keep praying, preparing and shout out to our God to take this Virus away.
